







Gender related issues in Guadalentin Basin, Murcia Spain

site and gender highlights

Soil erosion and water shortage are typical in this area. Most farm activities or responsibilities are traditionally made or taken by men. Women eventually participate in almond/olive harvest and home poultry care (in the few cases this

home activity still remains) and in some cases in paperwork matters (subventions, taxes, etc.).

Impact of land degradation on inhabitants (women and men) with and without changes in land management.

Our activities within the project indicate that stakeholder-women (essentially land owners or coowners, administration officers and scientists) have actively participated (19 men and 7 women in the 1st workshop and 10 men and 5 women in the 2nd workshop), followed by a field demonstration day with 20 men and 7 women participating, which is shown in the pictures. 7 men and 4 women are involved in the monitor activities.

Impact of DESIRE workshops

The measures they agreed upon to provide a mosaic of integrated land use might increase the possibility for both men and women on local work.



General remark on gender policy

The project strategy is also to improve the gender neutral approach in environmental research.
